Students with an IEP who exited the Texas K-12 system in 2019-20

The United States Department of Education Office of Special Education Programs requires that states monitor various aspects of the programs and services provided to students with disabilities. One area of required reporting is Indicator 14, the Post School Outcomes Survey. The intention of Indicator 14 is to follow–up with students who were receiving special education services while in high school (defined as those who had an Individualized Education Plan) one year following their exit from the public school system. Among that target group of students, Indicator 14 measures the percentage of students who are enrolled in higher education, competitively employed, or in another type of education or employment setting. This report contains survey results from the cohort of students who exited your LEA from the 2019-20 school year.

The research team sent survey invitations to the $\bf 8$ families in your LEA with a child with an IEP who exited the school system during the 2019-20 school year. A student or family member of $\bf 0$ of these students responded.

To increase the chances that you will receive an LEA report in future years, you can help us increase the number of responses submitted from your LEA. Possible activities include:

- Obtain updated student email or phone contact information before the student exits your LEA (we found that the majority of student contact records across the state were LEA-issued (for example, studentname@LEAname.org), which tend not to be used once the student exits.
- Alert families before their student exits the system that they will receive a follow-up survey one year
 after their child leaves school. This will help instill trust in the survey when they receive it and may
 prompt more families to reply.
- During the survey window, communicate with your exited families that the survey is live, that responses are important to you, and that your LEA team supports the state's efforts to collect this information.
- Share results with your current families so that when they are surveyed in future years, they are familiar with the data collection and see that your LEA is using the information.
- Add information to your school or LEA website about the Post School Outcomes Survey throughout the year, and especially during the data collection window.
